Stick to designated paths

When visiting sites, it is important to stick to designated paths where possible to avoid erosion and wildlife habitat degradation.



Conserve resources

Aims should be taken to reduce and conserve resources, remembering to turn off lights and heating or air-conditioning, reusing towels at your accommodation for example.



Souvenirs

Do not remove 'souvenirs' such as sand, rocks, peat etc as this disturbs both wildlife and nature. The USDA prohibits the entry of many agricultural products, which can carry foreign pests and diseases that harm agriculture and environment.



Food waste

Minimise food waste by ordering and purchasing what you need and using leftovers when you can.



Endangered species

Brack Tours does not approve of items that use threatened plant or animal products.



Support local

Support local economies by shopping for local products and eating locally.



Zero-single use plastic

Remember to bring a reusable water bottle that can be refilled - the water in Ireland and the UK is safe to drink. You can download a handy app to find the nearest water refill station [here](#).



Feeding Wildlife

Visitors feeding animals disrupts natural feeding behaviours and can lead to dependency on human food sources.



Environment

Observe wildlife from a distance so not to disturb habitats. We encourage you to use eco-friendly toiletries, such as biodegradable insect repellents, to minimise the impact on the natural environment.



Be respectful

You may be visiting areas of cultural or religious significance, you can check with your guide or a local member of staff at the site.
